Become A Personal Care Attendant (PCA)

The PCA Program provides BENEFITS, TRAINING AND CAREER ADVANCEMENT!

What is the Personal Care Attendant (PCA) program?

The Personal Care Attendant (PCA) program is delivered by MassHealth. MassHealth pays consumer-employers (individuals with physical, intellectual, or developmental disabilities) to hire PCAs to assist with activities of daily living. Consumer-employers are evaluated and eligible for the PCA program if they need support with two or more activities of daily living.

What does a PCA do?

A PCA is a person recruited and hired by a consumer-employer to physically assist in performing tasks, known as activities of daily living, such as:

- Meal preparation and feeding
- Housekeeping and shopping
- Help with ambulation and transfers

- Support with walking
- Help with toileting
- Help with bathing and dressing

Who is the consumer-employer?

Consumer-employers are individuals with physical, intellectual, or developmental disabilities who need assistance with the activities of daily living listed above. Consumer-employers are responsible to hire, train, manage, and, if needed, terminate employment with the PCA. The consumer-employer is listed as the employer on the I-9 and W-4 forms. PCAs are not independent contractors and taxes are withheld.





What is required to be a PCA in Massachusetts?

- PCAs must be legally able to work in the United States
- PCAs must be able to understand and carry out instructions from their consumer-employer
- PCAs must be 14 years of age or older (<u>some</u> restrictions apply to PCAs under 18 years of age)
- New PCAs must complete a New Hire Orientation training within nine (9) months of their hire date
- See other requirements in MassHealth regulation at 130 CMR 422.000



Successful PCAs are people that have:

- Compassion for others and a desire to help others live independently
- Ability to work with little direction
- Eagerness to learn new tasks and skills from the consumer-employer
- Willingness to learn on-the-job from the consumeremployer
- Desire to do work that is personally enriching and gratifying

- Strong communication skills
- Honesty
- Dependability
- Trustworthy

- Reliability
- Hard-working
- Patience
- Common sense


